Edward Stone, a longtime resident of Syracuse's Valley area, passed away peacefully on Sunday, November 3. He was 101 years old. His obituary said that Stone was a "proud Navy veteran."

Edward was serving as a radioman aboard the USS Pyro (AE-1), an ammunition ship, at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. He had just started his morning shift when another sailor noticed planes above. The ship was hit by a bomb but not seriously damaged, and four days later she left Pearl Harbor for San Francisco. Ed stayed with the Pyro until transferring to the submarine USS Bumper, also in the Pacific Theater.

He was one of the last survivors of the December 7, 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor which precipitated the United States entrance into World War II.

Ed's services will be on December 7th, 83 years after that fateful day. Rest your oar.
